During the 2021-22 school year, 303 student artists from fourteen schools created 204 beautiful works of art, including 79 paintings for permanent installation in five healthcare sites. They also created 125 Gifts of Gratitude paintings for healthcare workers at five hospitals to thank them for their service during the pandemic.
