YAFH's 2022-23 Projects and Partners

As the 2022-23 school year moves forward with some semblance of normalcy, YAFH continues to provide meaningful avenues for our student artists to create healing artwork for others. This year, we're thrilled to have students from 12 schools creating 156 paintings. Our 2022-23 school partners are: Albert Einstein HIgh School, Benjamin D. Foulois Creative and Performing Arts Academy, Charles H. Flowers High School, Georgetown Day School, Largo High School, Montgomery Blair High School, Richard Montgomery High School, Silver Creek Middle School, St. Andrew Apostle School, Suitland Elementary School, Thomas S. Wootton High School, and Wheaton High School.

For the third year, in addition to creating paintings for installation, students are creating Gifts of Gratitude for frontline healthcare workers to thank them for their dedication and caring during the pandemic. This year, Gifts of Gratitude include 37 paintings for individual healthcare workers at three hospitals and 20 paintings that will be installed on a Healthcare Heroes Wall in MedStar Georgetown University Hospital. Our on-site projects consist of 99 paintings for permanent installation at four healthcare sites. Our 2022-23 healthcare partners are: Adventist HealthCare Shady Grove Medical Center, Adventist HealthCare White Oak Medical Center, Holy Cross Hospital, MedStar Georgetown University Hospital, MedStar Health Physical Therapy at Pikesville, and MedStar Health Physical Therapy at Rosedale.
