This award is in memory and honor of Matt Papirmeister, cherished son of Youth Art For Healing founder Jan Papirmeister and her husband Chuck, and big brother of Sara. Matt lived with exuberance. A talented artist, Matt created outstanding fine line drawings, dry-wit cartoons, and whimsical clay sculptures. Kind and generous, he connected easily with others and loved making people laugh, often leaving family and friends in stitches. Raised in Vermont, Matt loved hiking, camping, and snowboarding. With his natural classic golf swing, he excelled at playing the game and competing in tournaments. He loved to travel, was a fearless adventurer, and made many friends on his journeys. Matt was always ready to give a helping hand and literally the coat off his back when needed. With love for this country, Matt enlisted in the US Army and served as a Stryker driver during the Iraq War. For his military service, Matt received the Army Commendation Medal in addition to seven other medals and ribbons.

Tragically, a week before his 25th birthday, Matt passed away after being struck by a car while helping a person with her disabled vehicle. Matt's kindness and giving spirit continued on with the donation of his heart and kidney, giving two people - a father and a young man - the Gift of Life.

In recognition of Matt's kind, caring, and creative spirit, YAFH developed the Matt Papirmeister Award to help students pursue higher education, continue to promote the important connection between art and healing, and go forward in life giving to others. The creators of this award envision a world in which healthcare environments are warm and welcoming spaces that promote healing and renewal. Our mission is to bring joy and comfort to patients, their loved ones and healthcare professionals through the vibrant works of art created by student artists.

The winners of the Matt Papirmeister Award will be determined by the YAFH Board that will review all applicants' essays, completed 18" x 24" paintings (digital versions), and evaluation scores determined by art teachers. The paintings created by the two award winners will be given to a local healthcare partner to provide a sense of comfort, inspiration and healing. All other applicants may choose to keep or give their paintings to a healthcare partner. The award is offered only to high school seniors. The vote is final and not subject to appeal.

Two winners will each receive a \$2,500 award payable directly to the post-secondary school where the respective students will be enrolled after high school graduation. In some cases, the award may be deferred for a period of one year. If the award is not used in that period of time, it is

forfeited. Each winner must produce a letter of acceptance and tuition bill. The award is to pay for or offset tuition and will not be refunded for personal use.
